
Everyday if you can -these are learning activities to support mathematics, reading and writing. Every time you complete an activity draw yourself a smile on a piece of paper - how many can you collect?

<p><u>Number 10</u> Practise telling stories with number 10 this week - for example 10 5 goats were on the bridge and 5 were in the field you can draw your number story make a different one for 10 each day you can write the calculations if you want an extra challenge $2 + 8 = 10$ -you can change your amount and find different answers.</p>	<p><u>Choose any book you have or any story you know.</u> Day 1. Listen to the story and see if you can retell it with some toys. Day 2,3,4 Draw a story map Remember stories have a beginning ,middle and an end. Do the beginning one day and then the middle and the end. Day 5 Then you can try and write some words or sentences</p>	<p>Practise writing short sentences - use your 'fred' fingers to sound out. Practise using the tricky word to and go in your sentences this week I go to the shop I go on a bus I go to bed you can mark your work and show your grown up how we put a tick for each sound we do and use our finger spaces</p>	<p>Practise writing your letters from the ladder letter family. Each letter goes down the ladder so you need to start from the top and go down. By the last day you should be perfect.</p>
